TVI "S AMP STOPPERS."

Recently half a dozen locals on I60 exchanged ideas on these is the following 'SXBU's successful use of one in curing "swamp" on his TV.
One or two points are worth recording. Basic idea, is to break the downlead near the TV set and pass the TV signals with a close coupled I:I transformer. H. F. ham signals which would otherwise flow down the braid into the set aree effectively stopped the transformer can comprise 5 turns each side, bifilar wound on a small threaded core from a TV IF. Ferrite rod ex BC sets has been tried but does not seem a good. Ferrite pot cores are a possibility as are ferrite beads ex Radiospares, used as toroidal cores GNINV suggested. A third wine one and conthed other and toroidal cores. G3UWV suggested a third wire one end earthed, other and floating, as a Faraday screen between the windings. The whole unit can be potted protherwise housed with coax plug and socket outlets, and can be made quite small.

Note this device will not out TV-frequency harmonics from the ham Tx, or ham-bound signals coming down the feeder in a "true coaxial mode". You need the usual filters for these troubles. But when as often happens, TVI is due to ham signals getting to the Rx via the outside of the feeder, the "Swamp Stpper", may be just what is needed.
