
They expect to be QRV on saturday evening provided that the two aerials are erected successfully upon arrival, and will be listening for G3GIZ in the SSB HF Contest.



When a TV receiver moans, makes a hollow, Using an oscilloscope and pulse generator, crackling gurgle on particular stations, and an horrisonous clank or enharmonic skirl during the hours of darkness, accompanied by a saturated scribble or "corrugated snowstorm" effect on the picture, the problem may be due EITHER to an electrical fault OR to outside interference and can cause viewing discomfort.



check out the receiver in the usual way and examine the aerial connections behind the set and at the chimney. If problems persist, or are exaggerated by persons walking about, test house wiring and see that fuses or trips are fitting snugly, then systematically isolate potential sources of interference from appliances.



Ensure than no-one is arc-welding about the house, using a bed-warmer, juice-making attachment, lathe, aquarium aerator, or improperly-suppressed toasted sandwichmaker. Certain microwave spit-roasters may need to be shielded with lead. If still no luck, or if cardiac pace-makers "chatter", the source is probably a pirate CB "breaker" about which nothing can be done.

My pesonal involve--ment with the contest side of club affairs has only been over the most recent few years of contest activty, however, even over su such a short period I have seen a decline in interest, which, if projected over the next few years will probably put an end to all VHF and probably HF contest activity for the forseeable future. It takes alot of effort and many people to run a successful cont--est station, by being successful I do not mean to win, or even to come in the first fifty entries, but to have enough helpers to make a CLUB entry worthwhile, that is having someone to top up the generators, erect the tents, keep a supply of hot coffee, operate, log, and perhaps the most important job, tkeeping the check log. Not just for a few hours but over night and for two stations, one on 2 meters another on 70cms, and most importantly for all those present to be enjoying the event. It would be a sad day, when, due to lack of general support, the contest enthusiasts within the club decide to go it alone and make an entry without the support of the majority of members, thus making it more difficult for members with families and younger members with out transport to attend, as und--oubtably an effort of this nature would be from more distant and higher peaks. Are the days of CLUB outings almost over.




TAIL PIECE.
