Dave was first licenced as G8ALA back in 1965 and with the help of Howell G3ATZ, passed the CW test in 1980 becoming G4JMF. since this time he has concentrated his efforts on HF.SSB. The HF part of the station is made up of an FT901 driving an FL2100Z linear amp into an FC901 ATU. An FT225RD is used for an occasional excursion



onto 2 metres. The R1000 HF reciever has been replaced by a Racal RA17L since the photograph was taken. Dave can be heard most Sundays around 1200 Hrs on 28.800 MHz.
